MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR


hange is an appropriate theme for our world, and the work done at PEARL Resource Centre in 2019/20. Viruses, injury, disease, closures, financial insecurity, homelessness, drug addiction, poverty, and abuse – new changes for many, and long-standing ones for some of the most vulnerable women on our streets. Yet debilitating problems can be an impetus for good change.

Good change begins with a changed mind and one step forward. From "I can't," to "I think I can," to "I will" was the experience shared alike by staff, volunteers and the record number of women who came through our door this past year. PEARL offered support, education and Jesus' love to more 100 prostituted women in Chilliwack in 2019/20. Some of this year's highlights at the centre are included in this annual report.

Another opportunity to help bring good change in vulnerable women's lives was training in February to offer an Ending the Game group at PEARL - a proven and powerful curriculum to help women understand the "hooks" that keep them stuck in "the game" of sex trafficking and prostitution and how to get out and stay out. In March we made the difficult decision to temporarily close the centre in an effort to minimize the spread of the Coronavirus, but continued our support by transitioning to street outreach and virtual support.

Change, globally and locally seemed overwhelming in 2019/20. Yet it's often in the darkest and hardest places where new life and hope spring from. Many women at PEARL made some good changes this past year. As a faith-inspired ministry, I'm deeply grateful we serve a God who does not change, and that lasting positive change happens as we partner with and become empowered by the Source of life and love!







originally began my journey with PEARL as a volunteer, believing I had been called to serve in the trenches – those tough places that people tend to shy away from. I had little professional experience to apply for work in this sector, but did have some life experience that could possibly allow me to offer compassion and comfort, and my experience as a missionary in a foreign country had taught me to be flexible and remain open to learn. What I did have, was a heart for the broken.

I have come to learn that there are tremendous blessings and the reward of unexpected growth when we step out in faith. I am learning what a unified force of love looks like, and the security that it can provide both for us and the women we serve. I am learning that sincere love and truth can move mountains and soften hearts, and I am coming to understand the courage it takes to walk that out.

I am learning that the humility to see others as equals and not with eyes of pity makes people receptive to hear you speak. The words we speak have power. How we speak them reveals our heart. 

Next Steps

With a business plan in place, and board approval to develop the curriculum, we need \$250,000 annually to open Life Renewal Place in 2021. A place where they can experience a transformative, sustainable recovery through life-changing programing that includes health care, counselling, employment and community building skills – a place to equip women for success!
